





Canoas House is a residential building and an icon of Brazilian modernist architecture, designed in 1951 and built in 1953 by the renowned architect Oscar Niemeyer.

Niemeyer's concern was to respect the unevenness of the land, combining the house and nature with creative freedom, using organic shapes and freeing them from the rigidity of straight lines.


This mule design is inspired by the lines of the house, translating this architectural language into leather, where the white upper refers to both concrete and organic lines. The cylindrical heel with an olive green lining is inspired by the columns that support the building. The internal lining is also olive green, inspired by the interior cladding and the surrounding vegetation of the iconic residence.

The blue insole is inspired by the swimming pool, which features organic shapes and complements the overall design. This project proposes a new vision of Brazilian luxury: discreet, sensual, rooted in modernism, and made to last. A vision where leather is not only sustainable but also symbolic and constructive.
