**Quality leather breaks down over time**, unlike plastics, making it a **better option for the planet**.


## Inspiration

#### Wounds to Wisdom

The Ozone Revival collection draws its core inspiration from the holes on a torn, discarded leather jacket — each one a visible scar of neglect. These intentional openings are more than design choices; they represent the real damage inflicted by overconsumption, carelessness, and fast fashion.

Just like the torn ozone layer, which once shielded the Earth but suffered from human impact, these garments once served a purpose before being cast aside. The holes echo environmental wounds, and the raw, hand-stitched seams are symbols of restoration — of choosing to repair rather than replace, to honor rather than discard.



#### Color Palette

Different Shades of Green; Woven in as a symbol of renewal, growth, and environmental healing — echoing new life emerging from old materials.

Accents of burnt orange, charcoal, or muted gold bring warmth and contrast, representing fire (transformation), ash (the past), and sunlight (hope).

**Earthy Tones;** These colors speak to stability, heritage, and the grounding nature of sustainability.

This palette doesn't just clothe the body — it tells a story of nature, damage, and rebirth. It visually ties the garment to the earth it aims to protect.
